Discussion on Assisted Suicide

Assisted suicide is hardly a cheerful topic of discussion, but on Thursday 10th April I had what (borrowing a phrase from Kathryn Mannix) I would term a tender conversation on the topic. I had brought together a small group with diverse perspectives – Buddhist, Christian, Hindu, Humanist, Jewish, Muslim, Pagan and Sikh – to understand where we were all coming from. As well as shared concerns and perspectives, I witnessed some of the most respectful, honest and tender disagreement I have seen in a long time.

We talked mainly about principles but also heard moving testimony of personal experience. Not only did we consider the impact on individuals, but on society, especially on legal and medical professions who will be tasked with delivering whatever the legislation finally requires.

It would be a breach of the confidentiality of a trusted safe space for me to share details, so there's no photo of our gathering.

As well as being enriched by the conversation, I am also heartened to experience living well across difference, an increasingly lost art in our fractured and divided age.
